Counseling addresses the mental health needs of individuals and families with expertise and empathy while providing comprehensive treatment in comfortable environments to help clients achieve their personal goals.



Conflict Resolution + Justice helps individuals, families, and organizations find peaceful and meaningful ways to resolve disagreements through conversation.



Family Support Services helps families navigate behavioral challenges and traumatic experiences through home-based intervention and support.



Employee Assistance Program

provides comprehensive wellness services to the Western New York community through employers.



Foster Care works to preserve families by finding temporary homes for children. We help birth and foster parents develop skills to nurture children in safe, loving home environments.



Domestic Violence Help through Haven House provides survivors of domestic violence with tools to stop the cycle of abuse and build a life free of violence.



Special Education through Stanley G. Falk School educates children, ages 5 to 21, with special learning and emotional needs.



Residential Treatment cares for children ages 5 to 14 and provides them with a safe and comfortable environment while teaching them essential skills and helping families prepare for their return home.

The non-profit is the culmination of the Buffalo Children's Aid Society, Buffalo Charity Organization Society (1877), and Family Service Society (1934).
